<u>3c:</u> QPRC Affordable Housing Working Group	Sarah reported action has commenced in Council for re-zoning land in Braidwood, Bungendore, and Queanbeyan to enable the building of affordable housing. Council is also looking at the use of tiny homes for emergency accommodation and looking for ways to control and limit the use of short-term holiday accommodation.

<u>Item 4a:</u> QPRC Integrated Plans 2024-25	Our response to the Integrated Plan was sent to Council but most of our questions went unanswered. Positive feedback from Council staff. Have forwarded QON for a future Council meeting.			
<u>Item 4b:</u> Palerang water access charges	BCA made a supplementary submission opposing the 15.6% increase in the Palernag Water Access Charge. Councillors rejected (5 votes to 4) an amendment proposed by Cr Willis to reduce the increase to 4.5%.			
<u>Item 4c:</u> Survey of residents	40 responses in two days (55% of respondents were rural). Sue will send the link to local Progress Associations to circulate amongst their members. Posters will be put up around town and notification posted in the Braidwood Bugle and Changing Times.			
<u>Item 4d:</u> Albion Sheds update	The Albion sheds have been demolished. Some materials will be available to the community. Several spaces were volunteered to store remaining materials.			
<u>Item 4e:</u> Milestone 3 Report	Draft report has been released and is available for comment on NSW govt website. A very good report and well received, but it is seen as a wish-list with no funding. Uncertainty about mention of 'site-specific exemptions'. There was a suggestion of a kitchen-table group of experts to provide our response. Draft report is on public exhibition until 5 Aug.
