Renewal 88 Wallace Street and Braidwood Car Park	 Works are first phase of a longer-term goal to relocate the depot and create housing sites. The carpark will get extended and a better two-way access to Ryrie St will be created. This project is to provide leading infrastructure such as water and sewer, some carparking and pedestrian link to Wallace St that can also act as a public space. An artist's sketch and carpark concept design have been prepared. We have received feedback from the community on the proposal, including on heritage items that should be kept, which sections of the existing structure should be retained, whether a Visitors' Information Hub should be included in this space, and any particular design elements that should be included. A planning proposal has been presented to recommend the change of zoning to permit the construction of the carpark on the site. A contamination report has been completed and the plan for decontamination is being established. An archaeological investigation, Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment and Braidwood Heritage assessment is currently underway. This includes an assessment of options for reuse of existing materials (structural, artistic or disposal). 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Braidwood Overland Flow Study	 Braidwood Floodplain Risk Management Study & Plan (FRMS&P) identified that existing development in Braidwood (including numerous main street retail outlets) is impacted by Major Overland Flow during intense short-duration storm events. This was not included in the scope of the Floodplain Risk Management Study (FRMS) which concentrated on mainstream flooding from creeks. The FRMP recommended that Council investigate and define the nature of and options to manage Major Overland Flow in the urbanised parts of Braidwood. Lyall & Associates were awarded the project. They have completed background information collection and model development, updated and refined existing models. We have completed community consultation, receiving input from the community about overland flow. The draft report has been completed and is currently being reviewed by Council and the Braidwood Flood Risk Management Committee. 	Public exhibition of the draft report to occur in June. 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Braidwood Stormwater Improvements	 NSW Public Works have been engaged to design a minor stormwater system running from the intersection of Duncan & Wallace Street to Col R.T Hassall Reserve, via Duncan Street and Ryrie Street. This alignment reduces the impact on Wallace Street and provides the opportunity to improve the quality of the stormwater through the future construction of water quality devices. Future expansion of the stormwater network has been facilitated in the design, such as extension of the stormwater system to Park Lane. Like all stormwater systems in Australia, the system will cater for frequent, lower intensity rainfall events and will not solve all stormwater issues within the Braidwood environs. Rarer, higher frequency events are being considered in the Braidwood Overland Flood Study. Design is 60% complete, and studies and 	Geotechnical investigations are currently underway.
